Good evening race fans and for the first time in 2025, welcome to the the capital of Australian Motortainment, the Perth Motorplex!

First off. How good was the High Limit International: Perth?!?

The crowd was massive, the racing was next level and of course, how amazing was it to see international superstar Kyle Larson walk away with not just his first ever win in Australia, but also the \$100k winners cheque! It was also a great reward for car owner Jason Pryde who stepped aside to get Larson on the track.

In other huge news, as confirmed on the night, High Limit International will be back again next season, with an increased

winners payout of \$110k, plus \$15,000 to win each of the preliminary nights! Racefans, I suggest you start making your arrangements now, because this year was he but next year will be even bigger!

I am so proud of what we achieved at the Motorplex: by the venue staff, the volunteers and officials in the scrutineering shed and pits, the infield team and of course the crew up in the Burson Auto Parts race control. A huge thankyou also to the competitors who put on a great show over the three nights, and of course to you, the fans, for getting behind the whole event with such great enthusiasm. All 10,725 of you (On the final night alone!) helped us to show off our spectacular venue to the world and I reckon we have made a big impact and will no longer be the best kept secret!

Tonight, we get underway with the 21st annual Sprintcar Muster event. This show was popular from the very first year, an all-open wheel deal exciting the fans and competitors alike and we are so proud of what we have created, particularly with it forming part of the USA vs WA Sprintcar Speedweek and with amazing support from our friends at Merger Contracting.

Scott and the team have been huge supporters of the Motorplex for a number of years and have helped us with projects like the asphalt around the entire outside of the Speedway track and of course the two infield 'freeways'! Merger Contracting is WA's largest privately owned asphalt paving company and since 1994 have been providing the highest quality asphalt services for residential, commercial and civil projects throughout the Perth Metro area, as well as regional Western Australia. Make sure you get in contact with them for all your asphalt needs.

Tonight's show features good fields in Sprintcars, Limited Sprintcars, 360 Sprintcars and Formula 500's once again. The bulk of our American visitors are still here in the Sprintcars and will be hoping to continue moving forward, and at time of writing WA had one win, the Interstate invasion had two and America had one in Speedweek... what will happen over the next few days?

The Limited Sprintcars have great numbers for their Martin Laughton Cup while the Formula 500's put on a sensational show at High Limit with Brendon Marshman putting in an epic performance, something he will hope to repeat.

Thanks for supporting the Motorplex over this busy period once again, and we hope you enjoy the show.

P.S. Anyone who finds any of the Migro Money/Gav Bucks floating around, please return it to the three dodgy looking security guards who were supposed to be guarding it!

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As was becoming a bit of a tradition, the ninth season of action here at the Motorplex kicked off on the 17th of October with a FAST show. Ten divisions were on show, with notable names including Rob Adley (360 Sprintcars), Peter Cox (V8 Dirt Modifieds) and Brad Mitchell (Production Sedans). Also on this program was the debut of the NOS Sprints (now known as Wingless Sprints), with Craig Bottrell claiming the inaugural win for the division here at the Plex.

The Super Speedway season kicked off a week later with Bronwyn Channing (Junior Sedans), Steven Ellement (Formula 500's), Scott Glazebrook (Speedcars), Shaun Bradford (Sprintcars, pictured below), Brad Ludlow (Late Models) and Peter Lyall (Super Sedans) all claiming feature wins.



After another FAST meeting, the second annual Magic Man 34 was on the card, with Dene McAllan becoming the first local to claim the win, defeating inaugural champion Mark Brown and Scott Glazebrook. Luch Monte grabbed the win in Sprintcars as did Brad Chapman in Formula 500's, Brad Blake in Late Models and Bronwyn Channing in Junior Sedans.

World Series Sprintcars returned to town towards the end of November with another two night show. Brooke Tatnell was back in the winners circle on preliminary night as was Brad Blake (Late Models), Brad Chapman (Formula 500's) and Rick Geneve (Speedcars). The final night would see Tatnell make it two from two, this time defeating New South Welshman Ian Loudon and American visitor Brian Brown. Scott Glazebrook claimed the Speedcar feature, Alex McLaughlin in Formula 500's and Ben Ludlow in Late Models.

A FAST show would again punctuate the Super Speedway shows, with eleven divisions on the card. Next up would be the Christmas Cup event on the 27th of December with Daryl Clayden claiming his first and only Sprintcar win at the Motorplex while Marc Giancola claimed his first ever Late Model win at the venue after previously only being victorious in Super Sedans. Also in the winners circle was Steven Ellement (Formula 500's) and Dene McAllan (Speedcars).

After a few days break, 2009 kicked off with the now annual Sprintcar Muster event, which also featured the inaugural WA Wingless Sprint Title.

Marshall McDiarmid would claim that race from Ryan Condren and Gary Balcombe, while Dene McAllan won the New Year Derby for Speedcars and Brad Chapman the Formula 500's.

Sprintcars wise, Anthony King would win the 320's, Rocka Zemunik the Limited's, Rob Adley the 360's and Ryan Farrell the Opens.

Shaun Bradford won the main event at the next show just before Australia Day, which was a lead in to a huge three night show in the first weekend of February, featuring the Australian Sprintcar Championship.

Held over three nights, the second night saw Brooke Tatnell win the preliminary feature, but it was Garry Brazier who added another Title to his list when he won the thirty-five lap main event on the 7th of February defeating Trevor Green and Ryan Farrell.

Wingless Sprints were support on the opening night with Lee Nash taking the win, Speedcars were on night two seeing Neville Lance victorious and the final night saw Scott Glazebrook win the Speedcars and Steven Ellement claim the WA Formula 500 Title.

Eleven divisions raced in a mid-February FAST show before Super Speedway returned again with yet another double header, this time the two night King of Wings event. Ryan Farrell won the preliminary night feature but it was Mark Wells who turned back the clocks and grabbed the main event win the next night.

Mick Hamon grabbed the Speedcar win on the opening night, Steven Ellement was victorious in both Formula 500 features and Craig Vosbergen did the same over the two nights in Late Models.

FAST Racing Series #5 was held on the 13th of March, with young upstart Bradley Maiolo claiming his first ever feature win at the Motorplex, driving a 360 Sprintcar, while future Late Model racer Ryan Ludlow claimed the Junior Sedan race.

Next up was the Australian Late Model Nationals, Marc Giancola claiming that win from Brad Blake and Ben Ludlow. Dene McAllan won another Speedcar feature as did Ryan Farrell in the Sprintcars, while Gary Higgs claimed a win in the Super Sedans.

At the Silver Cup show Brad Chapman (Formula's), Tom Watson Sr (Speedcars), Shaun Bradford (Sprintcars), and American Doug Drown (Late Models all won feature events) while a few weeks later the season opening Gold Cup event would take place.

Luch Monte (Sprintcars), Mark House (Formula 500's), Tom Watson Sr (Speedcars), Jason Higgs (Super 6 Sedans) and Scott Elst (Junior Sedans) were all victorious, as was Rob Adley who claimed the WA 360 Sprintcar Title on the final show.

The sixth and final FAST Racing Series show would wrap up the season on the 17th of April, giving us a total of 122 feature races held across the season won by 70 drivers.

Rob Adley was best of the bunch with six wins followed by Steven Ellement with five, while six drivers were tied with four wins, seven with three wins and eleven with two wins.



At the end of season awards function, Ryan Farrell (above) would also be presented with the Perth Motorplex Driver of the Year award for the second time in three years. American superstar Kyle Larson claimed his first Sprintcar feature race win on Australian soil, on Monday night at the Perth Motorplex.

One of the most versatile drivers in world motorsport at the moment, struck gold in the maiden \$100,000 to win High Limit International: Perth, from former Australian sprintcar champion James McFadden, while local track hero Callum Williamson was third

A capacity crowd witnessed the highest-paying Sprintcar race in Australia, on the back of huge crowds for the three-night series that attracted a stellar field of eight Americans, as well as some of Australia's best.

Larson's feature race win came on the back of a fourth at the December 28 show and a ninth on December 29 (which was a great recovery after hitting the fence while leading).

He was the star attraction for the High Limit event that is part of a ninenight Speedweek series which is also part of the 2024-25 Maddington **Toyota Sprintcar Series** championship.

Larson started from p6 for the 35-lap feature race but muscled his way to second by lap nine and after stalking race leader McFadden for some time, he hit the lead on lap 28 - once he got into clear traffic, he was able to stretch the legs on the 1K car, owned by WA racer Jason Pryde.

"I was pretty confident, even after the main event on the first night and then I got the wall last night, but I felt good about things today," Larson said.

"I am happy to get the win and repay these guys for my mistake last night and all the hard work they had to do."

> Larson said once he got to second, after a restart worked well for him, "I just felt I needed to pace him and hopefully catch him in lapped traffic - and then anything can happen".

"He was doing a really good job in traffic and I wasn't quite sure if I would have enough time but he started really searching for different lines and I thought hopefully that was going to break his momentum up a little bit and it did - and it helped me build some runs."

Larson said a visit to the Western Australian venue was something that he wanted to make happen.

"Honestly I have wanted to come for a couple of years, it just hasn't worked out for me, but it was neat to have High Limit be a part of this event and me being able to come here for the first time," he said.

"I thought it was a great event, a great atmosphere, the crowd was bigger that was I thought it was going to be too."

McFadden started on the outside of the front row, along Williamson, and was one of the event favourites after winning the two feature races on the two previous nights.

The very vocal local cheer squad in turn one, complete with their own horns, was hopeful of a Williamson win to reward his strong WA form.

Brad Sweet started and finished fourth, while defending Maddington Toyota Sprintcar Series champion Dayne Kingshott was fifth after starting from p3.

The race was only five laps old when a big crash on the back straight saw Daniel Harding limp from the cockpit of the W18.

There was another red light stoppage not long after which saw Ryan Lancaster and Kaiden Manders out of the contest.

While Larson was kept busy meeting long lines of fans after the race, his celebrations didn't kick on too long, as he had to head Perth Airport in the early hours of Tuesday morning, WA time, "before heading straight to Tulsa and hopping right into a micro sprint".

"It's weird to think that on paper. because we are so far ahead here, in Australia, I will be on track in Oklahoma tomorrow, so it's pretty cool."



While Larson has left, the majority of the American contingent and visiting drivers from the east, will regroup, heading to Bunbury Speedway last night for the next leg of the Speedweek schedule prior to returning back to the Motorplex for tonight's Muster event which should be a cracker.

While all the focus has been on the three-night High Limit International: Perth event, it has also been part of the Maddington Toyota Sprintcar Series.

With nine rounds of the championship in the books for the 2024-25 series, the battle for points is tight.

In fact only two points now separates defending series champion Dayne Kingshott from former series champion Callum Williamson - 1418 to 1416.

Williamson pegged back the margin with a third at Monday night's event at the Perth Motorplex, while Kingshott was only two spots back in fifth.

Kaiden Manders, who was an early casualty in the 35-lap feature race, is still third, but he has now been equalled on 1304 points with Taylor Milling who finished 15th.

Andrew Priolo, thanks to a solid 13th, comfortably holds down fifth on 1230, while Jason Kendrick and Brad Maiolo have traded places and are now sixth and seventh respectively on 1210 and 1198 points.

Jack Williamson, after taking 18th, is still in eighth overall on 1188 points, ahead of Ryan Newton, who was 10th, on 1162 and Aaron Chircop, who was 21st, rounds out the top 10 on 1116 points.

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

The Sprintcar Muster was first introduced in the 2004/05 season, the Muster beginning twenty years ago to the day, on the 2^{nd} of January, 2005.

Now in its twenty first runnung, the event is still as popular as it has ever been, and being part of Speedweek makes it even more appealing for competitors and fans alike.

That opening season saw racefans treated to a festival of open wheel events: the Sprintcars of yesteryear, the Super Modifiedss, on the program and won by Terry Tyler, the Speedcars featuring their New Year Derby won by Scott Glazebrook, and the baby Sprintcars (Formula 500's) won by Rod Bottrell (who won the feature though points went to Darryl Willsher).

Anthony King won the 320 Sprintcars, Russell Minchin the Limited Sprintcars and Shaun Bradford won the 360 Sprintcars. The main event saw the Sprintcars run not one, but two feature races: the first being the Boxing Day rerun after it was cancelled, which saw Ryan Farrell claim the win, while the actual Sprintcar Muster feature was claimed by Jamie Maiolo over Farrell and Jeff Leisk.

Exactly a year later the event was back, Shaun Bradford going back to back in the 360's as did King in the 320's and Glazebrook in the Speedcars. Mick Doble won the Limited's, Brad Warwick the Formula's, Gary Walker the Super Mod's and Ken Sartori raced his way to victory in the Sprintcars.

Over the years some divisions have changed: V8 Dirt Modifieds on the roster in 2007 (won by Peter Cox), Super Mod's disappeared off the schedule, Wingless Sprints were added in 2009 (doubling as the inaugural WA Title won by Marshall McDiarmid and then again the following year by Trevor Reynolds), and then the 320 Sprintcars also disappeared.

In 2014 the event was a two night affair, the same year that Speedcars were removed, while Wingless dropped off in 2017, leaving us with the four division format we currently have and have enjoyed ever since. 2017 also marked the last time the event was held in the New Year (January), shifting to a late December date, that is, until tonight!

Twice the event has been won three times in a row: Troy Johnson in Formula 500's and Jason Kendrick in Sprintcars both achieving the feat, while Steven Ellement has five victories in the event, closely followed by Ryan Farrell on four.

Excitingly, in the Sprintcars alone, the last four winners (and eight of the last nine winners) are also in the field, with plenty of drivers looking to add their names to the history books once again.

Last season Chris Dymock, after years of trying, finally claimed his first ever Muster win in the Formula 500's, while Trent Pigdon survived a green, white, chequer restart to claim his first 360 Muster win after previously claiming one in the Sprintcars.

The Limited Sprints event, doubling once

There has barely been a moment for the Formula 500's to rest, but riding high after an epic performance at the High Limit International show, the drivers are actually chomping at the bit to get back out on the track and put on a show.

At the last show Brendon Marshman was a sensation, finally breaking through for his first Super Speedway Saturday win at the Perth Motorplex with a dominant feature race performance. Marshman has been knocking on the door for a number of years now and it is quite possible that the flood gates have opened now, and he would love to grab his first Muster win.

Coming into the show, there are just two former Muster winners in the field, with defending champion Chris Dymock one of those. Dymock, who finally broke through for the Muster win after years of trying last season hasn't been running full time in Formula 500's this season, but a ninth on the 30th shows he is still in the mix and could well claim another.

Steven Ellement has won this event more times than anyone else, five times in the last fifteen years. A rare DNF a couple of days ago will certainly not sit well with the State Champion, also putting a big dent in his Opal Finance Track Championship aspirations, so he will be hoping to get back on track tomorrow night.



The man who leads that aforementioned Track Championship is Cody Turacchio, now forty points clear of Ellement thanks to four podium finishes from four starts at the Motorplex so far this season. It has been a while since drinks for Cody after a win back in the opener so he will be keen to get back on the winners list and grab his first Muster win.

Matt Brown has shown plenty of speed since returning to the track this season, but luck has simply not gone his way. Moving forward in every race and running towards the front at both shows, Brown hasn't been able to finish off with a good result for a variety of reasons, but if history shows us anything, he can never be counted out and he would love to grab that elusive Muster win.

David Sinagra and Shane Andersson are both longtime drivers with feature race victories under their belts, but neither have been able to stand atop the Muster podium so will be hoping they can break through this time around, while plenty of others including Rhys Cumming, Thomas Davies and Brendan Newmarch have plenty of speed and could well trouble the front runners.

It will be an epic showdown, so make sure you are trackside this Thursday night for a whole heap of mud slingin' Muster action!



How good was the High Limit show? So many amazing things happened across those three nights it is impossible to mention them all, but I will say, how cool is it that Callum Williamson was able to break a twenty four year old record? Granted, we don't run seven lap races very often, but the record was the third longest standing one at the Motorplex (and the longest standing Sprintcar record), set by Paul Stubber in 2001, so it is quite an achievement! The record was one of the few left standing prior to electronic timing (introduced in 2006 after a trial period in 2004) and is Callum's second track record as he currently also holds the thirty lap record.

With a flurry of race meetings in recent months, it is probably time to share the updated Perth Motorplex feature race winners list. We have held forty seven feature races so far this season, and it is still Steven Ellement who leads the all time list with forty five victories. Brad Blake still holds down second with forty wins, while Scott Glazebrook is third with thirty seven. The big change has been for fourth, with Neville Lance now being joined by Dayne Kingshott and Kaiden Manders on thirty four wins, while Jamie Oldfield is now equal seventh with Ryan Farrell on thirty two wins. Tom Payet (30 wins) and Jason Kendrick (28 wins) round out the top ten of all time! As for this season? James McFadden and Dayne Kingshott are tied on three wins apiece, while nine drivers have two wins each and twenty-three individual victors.

With space limited in the program we have not been able to pop in a USA vs WA Sprintcar Speedweek points update elsewhere.

with four nights complete (not including last night's round at the Bunbury Speedway) of the scheduled nine, it was James McFadden leading by 26 points over Williamson with Brock Zearfoss in third. Dayne Kingshott and Matt Egel both hold down positions in the top five while Gio Scelzi, Taylor Milling, Taylor Milling, Andrew Priolo, Kaiden Manders and Ryan Newton round out the top ten thus far.

Already established as a bonafide superstar before coming to the Perth Motorplex, the Magic Man was always going to enjoy the challenge of a new Michael Figliomeni venue after the confines of Claremont. Dividing

his time between Sprintcars and Speedcars, it didn't take 'Figs' long to return to his winning ways, Boxing Night 2000 seeing him race his Sprintcar in the 25 lap main event. Figs continued to create history, becoming the first person to win a

feature race in more than one category when he grabbed victory aboard the familiar #34 Speedcar in the New Year Speedcar Derby less than a week later. As if this wasn't enough, he also became the first person to podium in two different divisions in one night at the venue, winning the Speedcar fetaure and coming third in the Sprintcar on the 16th of February 2001. Over the next five seasons Figs wouldamass a total of fourteen victories at the venue (11 Sprintcar and 3 Speedcars). Unfortunately, after winning the first two races on the 2006 season opener, Figs tragically passed away, leaving a hole in our heat, but certainly holding place in Perth Motorplex history.

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

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
